Greetings from Rev. Ken Jones (a.k.a. "Ken's Ken.")

One of the unfortunate, if minor, consequences of our staying at home this spring was we missed the annual UUCY auction. As most of you know, not only is the auction a major annual fundraiser for the church, it is also a well-loved "fun-raiser" as it is a big social event itself, and also spawns many smaller social events all year long. I'm sure that many of you are sad that we missed this opportunity.

I have to admit though, that personally I didn't shed too many tears. As some of you may have suspected before, I'm not a big fan of auctions. That's just a reflection of my personal taste, not about the UUCY auction itself. While I do recognize the benefits of both the fundraising activity and the many social engagements all year long, I still admit that I'm just one of those people who doesn't enjoy the experience of live auctions. And I suspect I'm not the only one. I also worry that our auction has grown into one of – perhaps the only – major social events the congregation offers outside of Sunday mornings, and that can leave people with limited means or who don't enjoy these kinds of activities feeling left out.

Be that as it may, this year, in light of our having to cancel our auction, I want to make a suggestion for you all – two suggestions, actually – if you're concerned about what skipping our auction might mean for UUCY.

First, I'll ask all of you who do participate in the auction regularly to think about how much money you usually spend at the auction (I'm sure our church office can help get that information for you if you're not sure) and simply make a commitment to make an extra donation for that amount to the church, or prorate it and add it to your regular pledge.

Second, for those of you who usually do donate some type of social activity (a meal, a party, a hike, etc.) I'll ask that you commit now to plan to organize that activity at some point in the next year, and send out a first-come, first-served or lottery-style invitation to that activity via an email announcement or something. That way we'll continue to have various social engagements all year long that won't be contingent upon people attending the auction and making financial commitments. Win-win!

The only thing missing, then, is the fun time of the auction itself. Maybe when this quarantine is all over we can have a homecoming party and dinner, similar in scope to our auction event, but without all the necessary organizing around donations, bids, collections, etc. We can have a social event in which the only objective would be to celebrate and enjoy each other's company.

That sounds like more fun, to a curmudgeon like me, than an auction. But that's just me!

UUCY Book Club- Meeting On Zoom!


Our UUCY Book Club is back on schedule for Tuesday, May 12, at 6:00 PM.
