UUCY President's Report

Greetings friends!

We've had plenty to talk about recently, particularly the ongoing discussion of what to do with our building. In a week or so we'll know the results of the vote, and we'll either proceed with marketing the building, or we'll put the matter to rest for the time being.

Then it will be time to talk about a couple of other big issues we face:

First: When do we want to begin "re-opening" from the pandemic, and what will that look like? The way things are going in Yakima, resuming regular indoor "live" church services will probably not be possible till sometime in 2021. The same is true for all the other activities we have had to suspend during the pandemic. But, there are alternatives that we could consider – like having Sunday services (and perhaps other activities) held outdoors in September and October. Many of us would love the opportunity to meet with each other in person, even under the constrictions of social distancing.

Second: When do we want to begin a ministerial search? The survey we conducted a few months ago indicated a clear preference for hiring another part-time minister, rather than continue as a lay-led congregation indefinitely. We haven't yet begun a search, partly because of the difficulties of doing so while the pandemic rages, and partly because it seems presumptuous to hire a minister while we can't even hold services. But some of you may want to proceed ASAP.

The Board will, of course, be examining these issues in detail, but we'd also like to hear what other people think. If you want to share your thoughts, give me a call, text or email. (These days I've got plenty of time to talk!)
